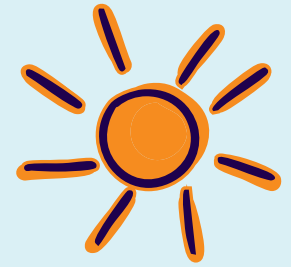
Yes, I have a disability, but I'm married, I own a house, I have a dog, I have my license and a car and I can solve just about any problem you can throw at me.

“Living in the home you do everything you like - walking, shopping, catching the blue buses. It’s close to the shopping centres, walking distance to everything. I got to pick things in the house like the colour of the walls. I love to cook, and the kitchen is big, there’s lots of cupboards for me to store all of my ingredients. My housemates definitely love my cooking. I cook Chinese food and cook a beautiful roast on the weekend. It feels very good to make food for people.

How to Leave a Gift in Your Will to Endeavour Foundation

There are several ways that you can leave a gift in your Will, and it is important that you choose the one that is best for you and your family. We recommend that you seek advice from a solicitor to ensure that your choice, and the wording that you use, reflects your exact wishes. The three most common types of gift in Will are:

A Specific Gift in Will

This is the gift of an item of specific value (including property or investments like stocks and shares) that allows Endeavour Foundation to generate funds.

Suggested wording for a specific gift in Will:

‘I give and bequeath free of all duties and taxes [Insert a description of the item being gifted] to Endeavour Foundation (ABN 80 009 670 704) of 33 Corporate Drive, Cannon Hill QLD 4170 to be used for its general purposes and I direct that the receipt of the Treasurer or other duly authorised officer shall be a sufficient discharge to my Executors.’

A Residual Gift in Will

This is a gift made up of whatever is left of your estate (or percentage thereof) after all your gifts, taxes and debts have been fulfilled. This kind of gift means you have peace of mind knowing that your loved ones will be cared for, while also expressing your enduring support for Endeavour Foundation.

Suggested wording for a residual gift in Will:

‘I give and bequeath free of all duties and taxes, the residue of my estate (or _____% of the residue of my estate) to Endeavour Foundation (ABN 80 009 670 704) of 33 Corporate Drive, Cannon Hill QLD 4170 to be used for its general purposes and I direct that the receipt of the Treasurer or other duly authorised officer shall be a sufficient discharge to my Executors.’



A Pecuniary Gift in Will

This gift allows you to nominate a specific dollar amount that you would like to leave to Endeavour Foundation.

Suggested wording for a pecuniary gift in Will:

‘I give and bequeath free of all duties and taxes, the sum of \$[amount] to Endeavour Foundation (ABN 80 009 670 704) of 33 Corporate Drive, Cannon Hill QLD 4170 to be used for its general purposes and I direct that the receipt of the Treasurer or other duly authorised officer shall be a sufficient discharge to my Executors.’
